1. OVERVIEW OF NDA

The National development Agency is a public entity listed under Schedule 3A of the Public Finance Management Act (PFMA). It was established in terms of the National Development Agency Act No 108 of 1998 as amended.

2. BACKGROUND

a. Introduction

The National Development Agency (NDA) encounters risks in the normal course of its business. The NDA wishes to cost effectively transfer some of its risk by taking out short term insurance as part of its risk mitigation strategies.

The NDA requires the services of a reputable, capable and experienced bidder that is a Registered member of The South African Insurance Brokers Association (SAIBA), to act as an intermediary between the NDA and the Short terms insurers.

3. PURPOSE OF THE BID

The purpose of this bid is to invite reputable, capable South African registered short term insurance brokers (Intermediaries) to submit bids for the provision of insurance brokerage services to the NDA, for a period of five years.

4. SCOPE OF WORK

Performance specifications:

The bidder should be able to provide the following general insurance services in terms of placement, maintenance and administration of the insurance portfolio:

- a. Conduct annual assessment of NDA risk profile and annual renewals
- b. Conduct market comparison of NDA insurance requirements
- c. Process and administer insurance claims and meet prescribed turnaround times
- d. Conduct quarterly service review meetings and advice NDA on new potential or emerging risks
- e. Prepare and submit quarterly claims history, trends and advice NDA management on emerging risks and possible implications
- f. Monitor premium payments and refunds in accordance with accounts and statements:
- g. Keep NDA up to date with latest amendments to the Legislation on Insurance through workshops;

a. Technical requirements

A detailed scope of services will relate to the following insurance covers;

4.1.1. Employees Liabilities

A cover to the NDA arising from numerous threats and its management, including. Security litigation, employment practices, fiduciary or crime related loss, accidental Injury or death and fiduciary liabilities:

- **4.1.2. Fidelity Guarantee**, to cover direct financial loss due to acts of fraud, forgery, alteration, robbery and safe burglary, computer fraud or dishonesty by employees resulting in dishonest personal financial gain
- **4.1.3. Directors' and Officers' Liability to** protect the claims made against the NDA's directors e.g., if ceases to operate and there are outstanding obligations from third parties.
- **4.1.4. Public Liability,** to protect the NDA against claims involving illness, injury death, damages to third party property including but not limited to; defamation, defective workmanship and products.

4.1.5. Assets

- To cover all tangible and Intangible Assets belonging to the NDA or which the NDA has any propriety or pecuniary interest against loss, theft or damage caused by fire or allied perils including electronic breakdown.
- To cover risk elements such as riots, service delivery protest (SASRIA), property terrorism and sabotage, fire, explosion, earthquake, power surges, alterations and additions, etc

b. General

 The scope covers portfolios identified at this stage and does not necessarily limit the scope to this. It is expected that the bidders advice the NDA of any other relevant portfolios

5. TRAVEL

A cover for an employee of the NDA whilst travelling on international journeys incurs medical and related expenses as a result of illness or injury or liability.

6. DELIVERABLES

The preferred bidder must develop a service plan annually with inception of a new insurance period detailing the actions to be taken. The portfolio service plan should reflect at least the following general insurance actions:

- Internal and external discussions to set initial and annual renewal and maintenance strategy
- Internal strategy meetings;
- Review existing cover;
- Establish uninsured risks and internal self-insurance capacity;
- Review cover, limits and sums insured;
- Annual Re-broking and market exercise to obtain renewal terms;
- Alignment of Insurance and Risk Management Philosophy;

- · Renewal follow-up on alternative quotations;
- Presentation of renewal terms and recommended options;
- Confirmation of placements and 100% cover;
- Confirmation of credit rating of insurance and re-insurance markets;
- Premium allocations on recommended aggregates and service fees;
- Compilation of detailed insurance manual as well as full summary on cover, limits, conditions and exclusions;
- Check and provide issued policy as well as legal confirmation of statutory compliance;
- Compilation of claims procedural manual;
- Ad hoc adjustments and endorsements on sums insured and declarations to insurers/re-insurers and issuing of accounts within 30 days of transaction;
- · Claims administration:
- Monitor premium payments and refunds in accordance with accounts and statements;
- Ad hoc training where required in terms of policy and procedural manual.

7. EVALUATION OF BIDS

Proposals received will be evaluated in the two phases in accordance with the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2017, using the 80/20 preference points system

Phase 1:

Bidders will be evaluated based on functionality in terms of the evaluation criteria set below. Only Bidders who meet the minimum threshold of 70 points for functional evaluation will proceed to the second phase of the evaluation.

Phase two:

During this phase bid proposals that received the minimum threshold of 70 points per phase 1 will be further evaluated for Price and BEE using the 80/20 preference points system. In accordance with the PPPFA Act, 80 points will be allocated for price to the bidders with the lowest acceptable price bid and 20 points allocated for Broad-Based Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) status level of contribution in accordance with the table below:

- 7.1.1 In order to claim points for B-BBEE status, bidders must submit a valid B-BBEE Status Level Verification Certificates issued by SANAS approved Verification Agencies or issued by Registered Auditor approved by the IRBA or Sworn affidavit .Exempted Micro Enterprises must submit a letter from the Accounting Officer who is appointed in terms of the Close Corporation Act.
- 7.1.2 Bidders who do not submit B-BBEE Status Level Verification Certificate or are non-compliant contributors to B-BBEE do not qualify for preference points for B-BBEE, will not be disqualified from the bidding process. Such bidders will score zero (0) points out of 20 points allocated for B-BBEE.
- 7.1.3 The highest scoring bidder will be awarded the bid, however the NDA reserves the right not to appoint any service provider and no service provider will be reimbursed for any costs incurred whilst participating in this bid.

8. PRICING

- 8.1.1 Service providers must give a detailed methodology and the professional fee structure that will be used to calculate the fees including annual escalations and any applicable taxes.
- 8.1.2 Service Providers must ensure that the quotes submitted have no arithmetic errors as NDA will not rectify any errors and no adjustments to quotations received will be permitted after the closing date.
- 8.1.3 Service providers will carry the responsibility of ensuring that their proposals submitted have been signed by a duly authorised person. Should it be established after the submission of proposals that the signatory authorising the proposal is not legally appointed by the service provider, the offer/proposal will be disqualified from the evaluation process.
- 8.1.4 All prices submitted should be typed in black ink or written in pen.
- 8.1.5 No proposals written in pencil will be accepted or evaluated.

9. NDA PAYMENT TERMS

Invoices will be paid within 30-days from the date of submission of a compliant invoice.

10. Acceptance of bids

- 10.1 The List of bids received on closing date and time of the bid will be published on the NDA Website within 10 days from closing date of this bid.
- 10.2 The name of the winning bidder will be published on the NDA website after the finalisation of the award.
- 10.3 No binding contract for rendering the required services will exist between the NDA and any bidder unless and until the Agency has executed a formal written contract with the successful bidder.

11 MANDATORY DOCUMENTS

The documents listed below are mandatory for the purposes of this bid and failure to submit any of these documents will result in immediate disqualification with the exception of a BB-BEE verification certificate or a sworn affidavit to confirm BBBEE status.

- 11.1 Valid Tax Clearance Certificate issued by the South African Revenue Services (SARS), proof of registration on the National Treasury supplier database (CSD).
- 11.2 Valid licence to conduct business as a financial services provider issued by the FSCA as per financial advisors and intermediary services act. (FAIS Act).
- 11.3 Evidence that brokers proposed to service the NDA meet the fit and proper requirements of the FAIS Act and are therefore registered with FSCA
- 11.4 Proof that contracts/service level agreements exist between yourselves, insurance companies and re-insurers.
- 11.5 Detailed financial proposal/ pricing schedule (including brokers and service fees)
- 11.6 Company registration documents (CIPC).
- 11.7 Valid BEE verification certificate issued by SANAS approved agent or sworn affidavit
- 11.8 A letter/resolution authorising the person signing the bid documents and contracts

12 CONTRACT AWARD

NDA's legal department will draw up a contract with the successful service provider for the purpose of contracting and outlining deliverables.
